These days we all take DST for granted, but where did it come from? The earliest known proposal actually comes from the writings of Benjamin Franklin in 1784, though his tone implies he meant it more as a joke.

While there was some talk in the early 1900's, it wasn't until World War 1 that attitudes changed, due to the need to conserve coal for heating homes. DST was passed into law in 1918. Although many people think of farmers as the driving force behind DST, they were actually it's strongest opponents. Their opposition led to the law's repeal in 1920.

However, DST would return during World War 2 in another attempt to save fuel, and this time it was here to stay (depending on your locality). Although there has been some talk more recently of again doing away with DST, such an act would need to be passed by the US Congress.
